Reminder: stages of cooperation projects



- Identify need or opportunity
- Develop project idea
- Find suitable partner(s)
- Organise the first partners meeting
- Agree objectives, tasks and responsibilities
- Prepare cooperation proposal
- Conclude cooperation agreement (including financial commitment)
- Implement the project
- Monitor progress, assess results
