

Round goby: An invasive fish species

First discovered in 1990

Today: Very abundant in some coastal areas

- 5-20 cm (medium 13)
- Predatory bottom fish
- Feed on mussels, small animals and roe
- Seasonal catch in April-June, close to coast, passive gears
- Not part of the Baltic Sea culinary

Taste and nutritional value OK! Eaten by tradition around the Black Sea








Latvia 2016-2020: Reported catch 500-1000 tons per year.



- Export of frozen Round Goby
- Local consumption fresh or smoked
- For cannery needs
- For fish meal (small fish)

Tests with cleaning and filleting machines
















Denmark, 2019: Round Goby served at the Roskilde festival

- production of pet food


Challenges to address - from by-catch to business:


